
Two Step Water Sanitation Instructions

SeaOtter WoodWorks Wooden Tubs

Follow these steps for a safe, simple and effective way keep safe hot tub water without the use of chlorine. To get started you will need to know how many gallons your tub holds...

Tub Volume (in gallons)

Tub Size	36"	42"
4' circle	200	260
5' circle	330	410
6' circle	500	600
7' circle	700	830
4' ellipse	160	190
5' ellipse	250	300
6' ellipse	370	440
7' ellipse	510	610

Step 1. Startup: Fill the tub with fresh water. Test water and get pH in the 7.2 to 7.6 range using Spa Up and Spa Down (7.4 or 7.5 is ideal). **Proper pH is important!** Turn on filtration system. Add Sodium Bromide (1/2 ounce per 100 gallons.) Allow pump to circulate for 15 minutes to mix the water.

Step 2. Initially add 4 ounces of Renew per 250 gallons and run filter for 15 minutes.

After each tub use, add two tablespoons of per 250 gallons and run pump/filter for 15 minutes.

If the tub is not used, add one tablespoon twice per week anyway.

Filter Cleaning

Clean the filter every two weeks. **Tip:** order one extra filter and swap filters each time. Clean and dry the spare.

1. Close two ball valves to isolate the filter.
Open the filter housing and remove the filter.
2. Spray the filter with a garden hose equipped with a straight flow nozzle. Work from top down and wash the pleats – especially between the pleats where the most dirt builds up. **Tip:** Wash filter in dishwasher if it fits!
3. Rinse until all the dirt and debris is washed off.
4. Filters that are exposed to heavy bather loads may clog with oils that can be soaked out with a cup of dishwasher detergent in 5 gallons of warm water.
5. Rinse again to remove oil and detergent.
6. If the filter is coated with algae or minerals, soak it in a solution of 1 part muriatic acid to 20 parts water until the solution stops bubbling.
7. Rinse thoroughly, install, reassemble, and open ball valves.
8. Replace filter every year.

General Information:

- Set filtration to run about 4 hours per day.
- Use test strips to check pH and bromine levels twice per week. Adjust pH and bromine levels.
- Never heat your tub water above 104 degrees - higher temperatures can cause health problems.
- Always shower before using tub.
- Always read the label instructions prior to using a product and use only as directed.
- Never add chemicals when people are in the tub.
- Store chemicals in a cool dry location out of direct sunlight.
- Change water when it seems to need it. Recommendation: 6 weeks maximum.
- **DO NOT USE CHLORINE** - very bad for wood tubs.

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
